A Message from Father Ken

Beloved,

The sacred time that is the week we can only call "Holy" seems to come almost every year when the secular time of "Spring Break" finds many of us on distant beaches. In a way, however, it is not so unlike what we see in the Holy Land itself. While Christians go from Stations of the Cross, to the place of crucifixion and resurrection, the vast majority of people, Jews and Muslims, go about their day only mildly inconvenienced by the buses that clog major streets and byways.

While I do believe in the actual, physical resurrection of Jesus, that resurrection was not just his reanimation. Something far more profound was bestowed on humanity. In his new book, *Melody of Faith*, Vigen Guroian explores the eastern Christian meditation on Holy Saturday, when, according to tradition and creeds, Jesus descended to Hell. The creed means that place where righteous souls awaited redemption and a welcome to God. It comes from the concept that human sin had closed heaven until a redeeming and worthy sacrifice could restore the balance of creation.

All pious stories such as these have power, not in their literal translations, but in what they point us to and what we are invited to experience. In this tradition, the captives are liberated . . . and we can be as well. Whatever imprisons us in hell, body or soul, is overpowered. Whatever holds us back from the new life, the whole life, the risen life is overcome and we are welcome to rise in spirit and in body to greet and live in a new way.

We allow the spirit of God to die slowly in us in a myriad of ways and decisions. Before long, and without even knowing it, we become more like a ghost or a corpse than the holy creation formed by God. But on Holy Saturday remember that after he suffered, Christ cast away everything that prevented us from rising the next day with hope and possibility and new life.

Wherever you are this weekend, remember that the week is Holy . . . and you are too. Become a blessing to

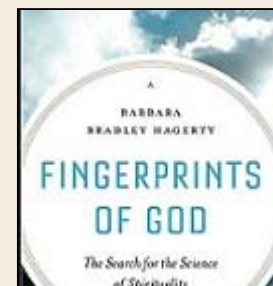

News from Buildings & Grounds Committee

Heating, Ventilation and Air Conditioning Improvements at St. John's Campus

Thanks to generous gifts from Captain Bob Morris and Ben Tucker and a grant from the Episcopal Foundation of Wyoming we have been able to complete an energy retrofit of our heating and cooling system. This will allow

up to a 35% increase in energy efficiency .

We worked with Lower Valley Energy and conducted an Energy Audit to determine the best possible steps we can take to make our buildings more energy efficient, ultimately saving money and resources Thanks to this generous support we have achieve the goal providing an efficient and comfortable space at St. Johns.

New Audio & Visual Equipment

A gift has allowed us to purchase a high definition camera which will allow us to broadcast services in the church to remote places around our campus so we may more comfortably accommodate overflow situations.

We have also ordered an advanced hearing assist module for the church.

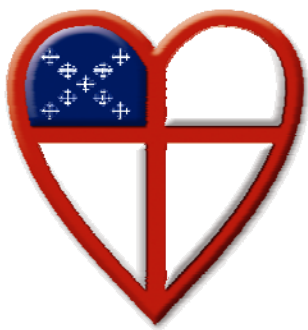
